Sophet is a shy 11th grade student. Although quiet, she is quick to smile and join in on activities. We notice that in our students' second year there is an increase in those who show significant interest in knowing more about God and their hearts begin stirring. Recently, when Sophet met with her mentor, she told her that she has decided to follow Jesus. When her mentor asked her why she was making that decision, she said, "Jesus is my Savior, the one who created me, the Son of God. This is why I believe!" Praise God with us

and pray for her as her family is struggling with her decision. We encourage the students to give their parents time, pray for them to be open, and show their sincerity in their faith through their changed lives. Please join us in prayer to that end.

2. **A 10th grade student** whose name I will keep anonymous, endures watching her mother abused at home when her father drinks. Afterwards, he says he doesn't remember what's happened. Her father tends to spend all the household finances on alcohol. When she was home over the break, she hired herself out locally for farm work so that she could buy clothes and food for everyone. After hearing this, her mentor encouraged her to pray for her father and joined her in that pursuit. While she was at home she told us that her father has made some radical changes. As a result, this student told us that she has placed her trust in Jesus. She says she praises God because of how he is changing her father. She will need continued prayer and discipleship through challenging days ahead, no doubt. Would you join in praying for her?

3. **Solea** is a spunky 11th grade student this year. She made a decision to follow Jesus while at the Plas Prai last year. She told us that her mother recently asked about her beliefs and Solea told her frankly that she has chosen to believe. She is very thankful that her parents were very accepting of this and told her that they would allow her to be baptized, though not quite yet. When she was at her house during lock down, she told us she was regularly reading her Bible and she loves to sing the songs about Jesus that she's learned at the center. Not long ago,

she decided to make a cross to hang at her house and her father helped her. Unfortunately, her grandfather wasn't very happy about that, but she chose to make it anyway. She is quite determined! She has asked us to pray that her parents will choose to believe.

Thanks for reading these stories. There are many more, but please use these few examples to join us in prayer for the 33 students who study at Plas Prai this year.
